WELCOME TO FIRST CHURCH!

If you are visiting today and looking for a church home, welcome! *For more than 169 years our Covenant has been: We covenant with the Lord Jesus Christ and one another, and bind ourselves in the presence of God to live together in all God's ways as revealed to us by the Holy Spirit and holy scripture. The church acknowledges that all members have the right of individual interpretation of the principles of the Christian faith and respects them in their honest convictions. In accordance with the teaching of our Lord, the church recognizes two sacraments: Baptism and Holy Communion.*

The liturgy of Morning Prayer is a form of daily worship adapted through the ages that has its earliest roots in our Jewish heritage. Its premise is one of praying to God at the beginning of the day—giving thanks for another day ahead. The service falls roughly into three main parts: Opening sentences and singing/reading of the Psalms; readings from Holy Scripture - usually one from the Hebrew texts, and one from the Gospels - interspersed with ancient songs of the church; and prayers. To this we add Holy Communion, bringing further meaning to the totality of the prayers we have already offered. The liturgy presupposes full and hearty congregational involvement in the spoken and sung responses, preparing us to be sent forth from this house of worship into the wider world to live out the Great Commission.

First Church Governance Task Force Explores Ideas from Vision 2027 Plan

The Vision 2027 long-range plan adopted at the annual congregational meeting last January called for the immediate establishment of a task force to review the church constitution and to suggest ways “to streamline, clarify, and modernize church governance, and church staff support.”

Church Council responded in February by creating the First Church Governance Task Force, which has been meeting monthly since March. Serving on the task force are Duan Cannon, Jackie Dean, Alec Deitz, Melody Leidheiser, Kent Shimeall, and Tom Worley. Steve Sterrett is the task force chair. Chris Farquhar, moderator, and Allison Lowery Palmer, moderator-elect, are ex officio members of the task force. The Rev. Emily Corzine is the staff liaison on the task force.

The task force is reviewing the church constitution to clarify the language where necessary and to consider amendments that strengthen the church’s administrative structure and operations. The task force also is studying the many recommendations in the Vision 2027 plan that affect commissions, committees, and congregational care.

Over the course of the spring and early summer, task force members have interviewed lay leaders and staff to obtain their ideas on improving church governance and operations. In addition, task force members are in the process of interviewing the leaders of four United Church of Christ congregations around the country for their insights on church governance. The Heartland Conference minister suggested these congregations because their size and missions are comparable to First Church.

Church Council created the task force prior to the resignations of Kevin Jones and Rev. Corzine. Their departure is a personnel matter being considered by the church’s Personnel Committee and Church Council, rather than the task force, which is focused on structural issues.

The task force hopes to develop a draft report to share with lay leaders, staff, and church members this fall for further deliberation and comment. The goal is to produce a final report with recommendations that could be considered at the annual congregational meeting next January.
