
By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned. By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace.

And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets, who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. Others suffered mocking and flogging and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned to death; they were sawn in two; they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented— of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains and in caves and holes in the ground. Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect.


Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.





Global Ministries Bosela Eale, Kenya

Bosela Eale serves with the Peace, Diakonia, and Development Office of the All Africa Conference of Churches (AACC) in Kenya.

The AACC is a fellowship of churches and institutions working together in their common witness to the Gospel. Its mission is to mobilize members to faithfully live the message of God's love; to nurture a common understanding of the faith; to interpret and respond to challenges to human dignity; and to act prophetically in Word, Life, and Service.

Dr. Eale states that for a long time he has been concerned about the problem of leadership in the continent of Africa. Although it is one of the richest continents in the world, many of its people are living in very extreme poverty. Those living in extreme poverty are the same people one finds on Sunday in different churches. He believes the church has a key role to play in the development of the continent of Africa. This belief led him to do research on Justice and Poverty in the Democratic Republic of Congo as his doctoral dissertation.
