THE HEBREW SCRIPTURE

Exodus 24: 12-18

A reading from the book of Exodus, chapter 24.

The Lord said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain and wait there; I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction." So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up onto the mountain of God. To the elders he had said, "Wait here for us, until we come back to you. Global Ministries

Thailand: Church of Christ in Thailand

The Church of Christ in Thailand has active programs in education of youth, health care, and HIV/AIDS education and prevention. The church began work with refugees in the 1970s when they aided a flood of Cambodian refugees; they now continue their refugee services with incoming refugees, mostly from Myanmar. They also provide vocational training to tribal women in the hope that this will reduce the numbers of women joining the sex industry. The church is responsible for two universities, two theological seminaries, seven hospitals, a rehabilitation institute for leprosy patients and other physically disadvantaged persons, about 30 schools, and a Student Christian Center.
