



The First Lesson

Acts 19:1-7

Leader: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles, the ninteenth chapter.

While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." Then he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They answered, "Into John's baptism." Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus." On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied— altogether there were about twelve of them.

Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."





BREAD Update

BREAD has voted to embark on a new research issue this year and will be receiving the mission offering this Sunday. Four different aspects of the current Columbus housing crisis are causing major problems for low and middle-income residents: 1.Increasing housing costs for existing homeowners; 2. Barriers to buying a new home for first-time buyers; 3. Evictions/rental problems; and 4. Unsafe housing.

This new housing issue, involving rental issues and vouchers, was not previously included in BREAD's demands for equality and justice. Continued followup with Restorative Practices, Elder Care, Police Violence and Environmental Concerns has yielded some important results: Columbus City Schools have committed to installing restorative practices in all Columbus City schools, reducing or even eliminating suspensions, and Columbus Police officials have begun a dialogue with BREAD on a police training program to equip officers to intervene in problem situations.

As we start the new year, may the hunger for justice be a continuing motivator in the work of First Church and an inspiration to our membership. Please give generously, so that BREAD rises!
