Paved Paradise: How Parking Explains the World

Come enjoy lively conversation and fellowship this February and March with the First Church Book Club.

On Wednesday, February 7, Elaine Warren will lead a discussion of Barbara Kingsolver's *Demon Copperhead*. Inspired by *David Copperfield* by Charles Dickens, Demon Copperhead is the story of a boy born into poverty in Appalachian Virginia and his experiences with foster care, child labor, derelict schools, athletic success, opioid addiction, disastrous loves, and crushing losses, using his wits to survive. Kingsolver makes plain the problems facing rural America. Equal parts hilarious, heartbreaking, and wise, it was awarded the 2023 Pulitzer Prize for Fiction.

On Wednesday, March 6, Todd Jacobson will lead a discussion of Henry Graber's *Paved Paradise: How Parking Explains the World*, an entertaining, enlightening, and original investigation into one of the most quietly influential forces in modern American life—the humble parking spot. Parking dominates and frustrates our lives and actually consumes more space in America than housing. The Los Angeles Times says this is an "entertaining romp packed with tales of anger, violence, theft, lust, greed, political chicanery, and transportation policy gone wrong."
