We see resurrection when, in spite of the seemingly impossible odds we face battling illnesses and overcoming suffering and grief, we walk in the light of God's love once again. We see resurrection in the faces of those who battle through hardship and peril and find their strength to stand and walk again. All of these resurrections are "physical," yet all of them are spiritual, as well. If Christ is not raised, then how do his people continue to rise and walk in the light of His faith, hope and love?

Today, I lift up two blessed people who embody Resurrection – Margaret Ruth Myers and Elaine Borling. Each shines God's light, life, and love. Each will carry the light of Christ today, Maggie at 8:45 a.m. and Elaine at 11 a.m. Thanks be to God for Maggie and Elaine.

Beyond Easter, we are here for you all the other days of the year.

First, join us each week in our life together as we seek to do justice in our walk with God in the heart of Columbus. Bring your friends, family, children and grandchildren to serve others, to receive the musical gifts of concerts and to grow in educational opportunities, and while you are here, visit The Washington Gladden Social Justice Park – the first Social Justice Park in America – located on the corner of Cleveland Avenue and Broad Street.

Second, members and friend are invited to join with us Sunday, April 7, as we explore our shared history as First Church and as people of faith with Dr. Emlyn Ott in a Healthy Congregations History Workshop from 12:15 - 2:15 p.m. in the Parish Hall.

Third, mark your calendar and plan to come to the Spring Retreat on Friday, April 26 through Sunday, April 28 at Camp Templed Hills in Belleville, Ohio. This retreat will be our last ever at Templed Hills as the Heartland Conference will be selling it. We are calling this "One Last Time in The Hills." Don't miss it. Sign-up in the next two weeks. Fourth, join in our justice and mercy mission—locally, nationally, and around the globe. There is room for you to collaborate with our members in Good Samaritan, care for our unhoused friends living around our church, The Largest Table Wednesday lunches downtown, and at Friends of the Homeless where we serve our neighbors. Each Christmas, we host Bethlehem on Broad Street, opening our doors and our hearts to the lost and the lonely in our beloved city. We do the work of justice through the B.R.E.A.D. organization. Mark your calendar and join us Tuesday, May 21st at 6:30 p.m. for our 2024 Nehemiah Action at the Celeste Center on the Ohio State Fairgrounds. Join 40 other interfaith congregations as together we work for justice in policing reform, street violence, affordable housing and Environmental Justice. See one of our staff today to discover how you can get involved.

Finally, discover the many offerings for Bible and Book Studies, Stephen Ministry, Care Ministry and Music Ministry offerings. We have many opportunities to gain experience in faith here at First Church. We long for you to join us as we grow together.

For 22 ½ years, First Church has been an Open and Affirming congregation of the United Church of Christ—welcoming all God's children with an extravagant welcome of love in Christ.

If you are seeking God's love in your life, please come and grow in your faith with us. If you call First Church "home" but have been away for a long time, welcome home. We have missed you and we are delighted you are here. Come and share with us a 365-day experience once again.



Leader: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles, the tenth chapter. 11 – Jonathan Miller

Then Peter began to speak to them: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to God. You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

Mark 16:1-8

Leader: A reading from the Gospel according to Mark, the sixteenth chapter.

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint Jesus. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

We give thanks for the colorful diversity we share as one people, created in Your image.





# The Sacrament of Holy Communion


We practice open communion: Wherever you are on your faith journey, you are welcome at the Lord's table.






We give you thanks, God of majesty and mercy, for calling forth the creation and raising us from dust by the breath of your being. We bless you for the beauty and bounty of the earth and for the vision of the day when sharing by all will mean scarcity for none. We remember the covenant you made with your people Israel, and we give you thanks for all our ancestors in faith. We rejoice that you call us to reconciliation with you and all people everywhere and that you remain faithful to your covenant even when we are faithless. We rejoice that you call the entire human family to this table of sacrifice and victory.

We come in remembrance and celebration of the gift of Jesus Christ, whom you sent, in the fullness of time, to be the good news. Born of Mary, our sister in faith, Christ lived among us to reveal the mystery of your Word, to suffer and die on the cross for us, to be raised from death on the third day, and then to live in glory. And now we give you thanks for the hope to which you call us in your Son, that following in the faith of all your saints, we may run with perseverance the race that is set before us, and with them receive the unfading crown of glory. We bless you, gracious God, for the presence of your Holy Spirit in the church you have gathered. With your sons, daughters, and all children of faith in all places and times, we praise you with joy.





The congregation may be seated.

We remember that on the night of betrayal and desertion, and on the eve of death, Jesus gathered the disciples for the feast of Passover. Jesus took bread, and after giving thanks to you, broke it, and gave it to the disciples, saying: "This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

## Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Eternal God, we unite in this covenant of faith, recalling Christ's suffering and death, rejoicing in Christ's resurrection, and awaiting Christ's return in victory. We spread your table with these gifts of the earth and of our labor. We present to you our very lives, committed to your service on behalf of all people. We ask you to send your Holy Spirit on this bread and wine, on our gifts, and on us. Strengthen your universal church that it may be the champion of peace and justice in all the world. Restore the earth with your grace that is able to make all things new.

Be present with us as we share this meal, and throughout all our lives, that we may know you as the Holy One, who with Christ and the Holy Spirit, lives for ever. **Amen.** 

Let us pray as Christ our Savior has taught us.

Our Father, who art in Heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.
