THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

Acts 3:12-19

Mr. Winters

Leader: A reading from the book of Acts, the third chapter.

Peter addressed the people, "You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? 
Leader: A reading from the First Letter of John, the third chapter.

Leader: A reading from the Gospel according to Luke, the twenty-fourth chapter.

He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself.
