Music, Arts, and Heritage Commission's Goals and Dreams for 2026

The Art Committee encourages the arts in our liturgy, building, and congregational life. The Art Committee chaired by Becky Taft hopes to purchase new furniture for the senior pastor's and associate pastor's offices. In addition, a refresh of the Youth Room is a priority, as is replacing the carpet in the lower narthex with stone flooring. Finally, the Art Committee plans to remove all nails in plaster walls, repair the holes and use the 1931 molding to hang artwork using a STAS hanging system.

The Heritage Committee maintains the church's archives of historic records, organizing and making them available when needed. Heritage would like to enhance our archival efforts by:

- Software purchases to enable us to capture Rev. David's sermons in written form so the Archives can maintain and preserve the sermons as we have from previous ministers.
- Equipment purchases to make possible the digitization of thousands of written documents and other historical records from our archives that will be housed and made available to the congregation and the public-at-large through the Memorandum of Understanding established between First Church and the Columbus Metropolitan Library.
- Additional software and equipment to continue to support the creation and publication of the monthly “From the Archives” entries and the quarterly “First Stories” interviews conducted by Nancy Braverman.

Our music program led by Minister of Music Josh Stafford has an exciting concert series planned for the coming year. Highlights include:

- February 22nd (Sunday) organ and orchestra. This will be a smaller orchestra ensemble conducted by Ron Jenkins with Josh at the organ in the Gallery.
- March 5th (Thursday) Concordia Choir. The choir will perform at no charge to the church. Concordia Choir will ticket for the concert separately.
- April 4th (Saturday) Easter Vigil. Josh is proposing a new first for the church at 7 p.m. He hopes to have brass and a reception afterwards.
- April 5th (Sunday) Easter. Josh is proposing only one service with choir and brass.
- May 3rd (Sunday) First Church Ringers. This will be the group's first concert.

The Campanelle Bell Group has been organized by Jennifer Fry. Family Organ Day returns in January. A Singing and Bell Ringing Day Camp is planned for June 8-12, 2026.

Music continues to expand audiences for events and the type of events.
