



Healing Rev. jess young chang

I'm really looking forward to our Healing Service next month, on Sunday, November 23, at 10 a.m. here at First Church, and I hope you are too. Some of us in this community are ready to let go of the pain and turn the page on the pain or resentment you've been carrying around. Some of us aren't ready yet. Even pain can be something we get familiar with experiencing, and the idea of putting it down, softening our hearts, and starting fresh is scary. If you are anything like me, you may be holding on to a story or an expression of grief or resentment. Maybe you don't feel like you have any place to put it, or maybe you don't know what will happen if you put it down.

Our God has a thought about that, and we heard from Pastor Becky about it just last week. "[T]he days are coming, says YHWH, when I will establish a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah... I will put my Law in their minds and on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people... All of them, high and low alike, will listen to me, says YHWH, for I will forgive their misdeeds and will remember their sins no more." (Jeremiah 31:31, 33). God is inviting us into a season of new covenant as a congregation, rooted in the love of Christ and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. But to have our hearts and spirits ready for this service, we need to leave our gift at the altar and be reconciled to our sibling, as Christ teaches us to do.

To help with this process, First Church is hosting Healing Circles between now and our Healing Service on November 23. Facilitated by your Interim Ministers, Circle Practice emerges from spiritual, cultural, and religious practices and communities all over the world and it has been practiced in circles of community, healing, decision making, and restorative justice for centuries. In this practice, participants engage in safe, open communication and presence, and practice deep, confidential listening, and story sharing from the tenderness and vulnerability of our hearts. Please join us for deep listening, open sharing, and acknowledging of pain that is blocking our way to experiencing the healing and transformation of Christ.

There are three opportunities to experience a Healing Circle: Wednesday, October 29, 6:30-8 p.m.; Thursday, November 6, 6-7:30 p.m., and Monday, November 10, 2-3:30 p.m. Please don't miss an opportunity to join Spirit, others, and your own listening heart to share what you need to and bear confidential witness to one another. Join us in the circle.
