IN THE BEGINNING

guarding me with Her radiance.

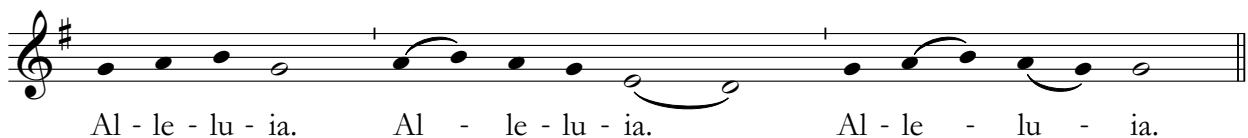

BAPTISM OF DAKOTA SAUNDERS

Leader: Dear Friends, as we come to this font of Living Water,
the water that connects us to Christ, let us recall the meaning of baptism.
For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body,
though many, are one body, so it is with Christ.

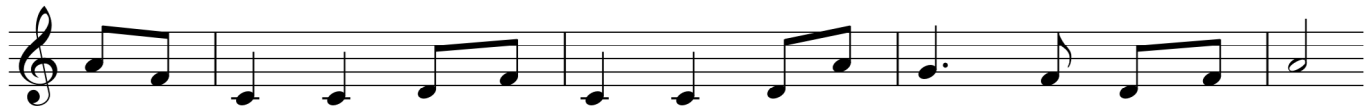

Preservation Grant Information Today at 10 a.m. in Parish Hall

Immediately following the 9 a.m. worship service, the Preservation Grant Committee will provide an information session regarding the grant project and plans for the fundraising campaign. It is the same presentation that will take place at the congregational meeting today at 12:15 p.m. in the Sanctuary. This 15 minute presentation will be followed by a time for questions and answers.

Special Congregational Meeting Today at 12:15 p.m. in the Sanctuary

Today's Congregational meeting will be regarding the grant preservation project. The meeting will review the results of a recent building assessment report completed by architectural firm of Schooley Caldwell.

A vote will be taken to approve a fundraising campaign to raise match dollars to support this important grant project. The National Fund for Sacred Places has awarded a \$250,000 grant as an incentive for the church to undertake the needed construction project at this time. The intended work includes: repairs to the Rose Window, the front steps, and several areas of mortar and stone work around the church.

Each generation of church members has the honor and opportunity to step up and find ways to contribute financially or otherwise to maintain our incredible worship and community center. It is our turn to keep the building in good repair. The Congregational meeting will provide details of how the grant project can be funded by a variety of sources to complement an intended fund-raising campaign with the membership.
